## Average Tudor Women

Head dress



**Bodice:**  
A laced up support worn over the top of other clothes.

**Gown:**  
This was split at the front to reveal the kirtle.

**Kirtle:**  
The coloured main underskirt

## Wealthy Tudor Men

Coat



**Doublet:**  
Tight fitting jacket that was stuffed and then quilted.

**Hose:**  
Woollen tights

## Wealthy Tudor Women

Ruff



**Corset:**  
Underwear stiffened with wood or bone to smooth out lumps and bumps.

**Farthinggale:**  
A underskirt with rings in it to hold the rest of the outfit out wide

## Average Tudor Men

Hat



**Breeches:**  
These were tied at the knees with laces

**Shoes:**  
Made from leather, even the sole, the left and right would be the same
